MINISTER OF THE STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF TEXTILES (SMT. PANABAAKA LAKSHMI)

- (a) & (b): The domestic fibre consumption ratio in India at present is 41:59 (FY-09) between man-made fibre and cotton.
- (c) & (d): Government has formulated a fibre neutral National Fibre Policy, with a view to balance the existing disparities within the complete range of fibres.
