- (a) whether there was any plan allocation of the Forest Department of A&N Administration during Eighth, Ninth, Tenth and Eleventh Plan for promotion of Eco-Tourism and Medicinal Plants in A&N Islands;
- (b) if so, the year-wise actual physical and financial achievements during the above period;
- (c) the total amount surrendered during the above-said period;
- (d) the name of Eco-Tourism places where tourist visited along with their numbers; and
- (e) the employment generated as a result thereof/income of farmers through the medicinal plants for the above plan years?

(a),(b) & (c) As per the information received from the Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, there was Plan Allocation to the Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands Forest Department for promotion of Eco-tourism during 10th and 11th Five Year Plan. However, there was no allotment during 8th and 9th Five Year Plan for Eco-tourism. The details of year – wise financial achievement under Scheme "Eco-Tourism" are in the Annexure.

Further, there was no plan allocation for promotion of medicinal plants to the Forest Department in the Union Territory during 8th, 9th, 10th and 11th Five Year Plan periods. No amount has been surrendered during this period.
