(a)No separate evaluation has been undertaken using 11th Five Year Plan funds of the ongoing World Bank funded projects for strengthening of the health care systems.

(b) During the 11th Five Year Plan, World Bank funded projects for strengthening of secondary healthcare systems were/are being impiemented in Karnataka (2006-2012), Rajasthan (2004-2011), Tamil Nadu (2004-2010), Uttar Pradesh including Uttrakhand (2000-2008)

(c)&(d): Yes, Madam. Under the National Rural Health Mission (NRHM), funds are provided to the State/UT Governments for upgradation and operationalization of the District Hospital (DH)/Sub-District Hospital (SDH)/ Community Health Centers (CHCs) etc. as First Referral Units (FRUs) for providing comprehensive services for emergency obstetric and newborn care, in addition to other emergencies. Funds are also provided for augmentation of Specialist manpower in these facilities. Multi -skilling of doctors and paramedics, provision of financial incentives for serving in difficult areas, improved accommodation facilities etc are some of the measures to increase availability of staff in peripheral areas.
