DEATH DUE TO MEASLES

## Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether measles is making a rapid comeback;
(b) if so, whether deaths due to this disease have risen to 74 per cent world wide;
(c) if so, the position in regard to India due to this disease;
(d) whether as per the World Health Organisation (WHO) anti-measles efforts have suffered due to inadequate funding and lack of political commitment since 2008; and
(e) if so, the efforts being made by the Government to eradicate this disease from India?

## Answer

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH \& FAMILYWELFARE (SHRI GHULAM NABIAZAD)
(a) \& (b): No. Deaths due to measles declined globally by $78 \%$ from an estimated 733,000 deaths in 2000 to 164,000 deaths in 2008.
(c): As per the available data of Central Bureau of Health Intelligence (CBHI), the measles cases reported in 1975 was about 1,33,561 as compared to 40,840 in 2009 (Provisional), thus recoding a decline of 69\%.
(d) \& (c): Government has provided required funding for anti-measles efforts and has included the second dose of measles under the Universal Immunization programme in the entire country. In 14 states where evaluated coverage of measles is less than $80 \%$ the measles Supplementary Immunization Activity (SIA) is being carried out by mass measles vaccination. This will be followed by second dose of measles vaccination under the Universal Immunization Programme.
