(b) if so, the details of such cases reported in the last year and the current year so far, State/UT-wise;

(c) the steps taken/proposed by the Government for the elimination of the disease from the country;

(d) whether the Government has received complaints regarding nonavailability of medicines meant for the patients of Leprosy in the Government hospitals and dispensaries, particularly in the rural areas of the county; and

(e) if so, the details thereof alongwith the action taken thereon?

(i) Decentralized integrated leprosy services through General Health Care System

(ii) Training in leprosy detection and treatment to General Health Services functionaries.

(iii) Intensified Information, Education & Communication (IEC).

(iv) Renewed emphasis on Prevention of Disability and Medical Rehabilitation &
