Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government has appointed interlocutors and sent a delegation to interact with the various sections of the civil society and seek to find possible solutions for the problems in Jammu & Kashmir and to help restore normally in the State;

- (b) if so, the details thereof along with recommendations made in the reports submitted by them;
- (c) the follow-up action being taken by the Government thereon;
- (d) whether the Government has evaluated the role played by the interlocutors;
- (e) if so, the details thereof;
- (f) whether the efforts made by the interlocutors has helped in restoring peace in the State; and
- (g) if so, the details thereof?

Answer

(a) to (g): On 13th October 2010, the Government had appointed Dr. Dileep padgaonkar, Professor M.M. Ansari and Prof (Ms) Radha Kumar as interlocutors to hold sustained dialogue with a wide range of important representatives of political and public opinion to draw up a road map for a possible settlement of the political problem in the State of Jammu & Kashmir. The Group of Interlocutors have made a number of recommendations in the nature of confidence building measures, including expediting cases of under trials, permitting peaceful protests, releasing militants/Protestors against whom there are no serious charges, training of security forces, identifying jobs for young men and women in Central/State Government offices etc. These recommendations have been able to persuade a number of stakeholders to offer suggestions for a political solution. The law and order has improved in the State.
