## Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) the total area of cultivable land being farmed in the country particularly in tribal areas, as on date;
(b) the additional area of land available for being brought under cultivation;
(c) the extent of loss incurred due to non-cultivation of the said land; and
(d) the remedial steps proposed to be taken in this regard?

## Answer

MINISTER OF THE STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND MINISTER OF THE STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES (SHRI ARUN YADAV)
(a): As per available estimates (2008-09), the total cultivable land is 182.385 million hectare in the country. Separate data on cultivable land being farmed in tribal areas are not maintained by Government of India.
(b): Barren and un-culturable land having an extent of about 17.02 million hectare (2008-09) though available, cannot be brought under cultivation except at an exorbitant cost.
(c): Does not arise.
(d): With a view to prevent land degradation and to maintain balance in various types of land uses, Government of India is implementing various Watershed Development Programmes namely; (i) National Watershed Development Project for Rainfed Areas (NWDPRA), (ii) Soil Conservation in the Catchments of River Valley Project and Flood Prone River (RVP \& FPR),(iii) Reclamation and Development of Alkali \& Acid Soils (RADAS),
(iv) Watershed Development Project in Shifting Cultivation Areas (WDPSCA) \& (v) Integrated Watershed Management Programme (IWMP) etc. across the country.
