- (a): The Integrated Low Cost Sanitation Scheme (ILCS) has been revised in January, 2008 and proposals have been received for sanction under the revised guidelines from the State of Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, West Bengal, Kerala, Manipur, Nagaland, Uttarakhand, Maharahstra, Madhya Pradesh, Tripura and Rajasthan under the scheme. The details of proposals under the Integrated Low Cost Sanitation (ILCS) Scheme received from various State Government and Union Territory Administrations, Number of proposal approved out of them and the funds allocated and released thereunder during each of the last three years and current year, State/UT-wise is at Annexure -I.
- (b): Details of project completed and the number of units built alongwith the utilization of funds under the scheme during the said period, State/UT- wise is at Annexure -II.
