## Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) the names of short wave broadcasting centres in the country and details of such stations/centres set up during each of the last three years and the current year, State-wise;

(b) the names of the said centres more than ten years old, State-wise;

(c) whether the Government proposes to increase their broadcasting capacity;

(d) if so, the details thereof; and

(e) if not, the reasons therefor?

## Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (DR. S. JAGATHRAKSHAKAN)

(a) Prasar Bharati has informed that at present, 28 Short Wave (SW) Broadcasting centres of AIR are functioning in the country. No new SW centres / stations have been setup during the last three years and the current year. The state-wise details of the existing AIR SW stations are given in Annexure.

(b) All the 28 SW AIR centres are more than 10 years old.

(c) & (d) Yes, Sir. At Delhi, 100 kW SW transmitters (2 nos.), at Aligarh, 250 kW SW transmitters (2 nos.) and at Bangalore, 500 kW SW transmitter (1 no.) are being replaced by new digital (DRM) transmitters in the New Scheme under 11th Plan.
