(a) to (c) One of the schemes included in the Prime Minister's New 15 Point Programme for the Welfare of Minorities is upgradation of skills through technical training, under which identified Industrial training Institutes (ITIs) are upgraded to Centres of Excellence or new ITIs are set up. 60 Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) located in minority concentration districts have been covered for upgradation into Centres of Excellence by the Ministry of Labour & Employment which is included as one of the schemes under the Prime Minister's New 15 Point Programme for the Welfare of Minorities. However, there is no proposal to launch pilot projects for setting up and expansion of Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) under Prime Minister's 15 Point Programme for the Welfare of Minorities in different States, including Punjab.
