- (e) whether the persons punished for corruption would be declared permanently unfit to contest election/hold any public office; and

In view of this, the Central Government has constituted a GoM to consider measures that can be taken to tackle corruption. One of the terms of reference is to consider all measures, including legislative and administrative, to tackle corruption and improve transparency. The GoM is yet to submit its recommendations.
