- (a) whether the Food Corporation of India (FCI) has undertaken/proposes to undertake computerisation project for networking of all its godowns spread across the country for better inventory management;
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the time by which the project is likely to be completed alongwith the cost involved therein?

(a)&(b): Yes, Madam. Food Corporation of India has undertaken a project for computerization of stocks under Integrated Information System for Foodgrains Management (IISFM). The IISFM Project was undertaken as a Plan Scheme with a total estimated cost of Rs.97.66 Crore in August, 2003 with objective to put in place an on-line MIS for stock position in any FCI Depot at any given point of time.

For implementation of the project, a Tripartite Agreement was entered by FCI, National Informatics Centre (NIC) and National Informatics Centre Services Incorporated (NICSI) on 24/09/2003. As per the agreement, NIC is the overall consultant of the project on turnkey basis; NICSI is supplying hardware, software and support services.

Scope of the project was widened in October, 2005 to include 'Financial Accounting of FCI' & 'Computerization of State Agencies' of major procuring/distributing States.

IISFM software is divided in two Modules – District Module and Depot Module. District Module is fully operational since June, 2006. Depot Module is in an advanced stage of implementation.

(c): Target date of completion of the project as per MoU signed with Ministry of CAF&PD is 31st December, 2009. Total estimated cost of IISFM Project is Rs.97.66 crore.
