- (a) and (b) State-wise details of the proposals received from various State Governments for upgradation and conversion of roads/State Highways (SHs) into National Highways (NHs) during each of the last three years in the country including Rajasthan, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Orissa, Uttrakhand and Maharashtra are annexed. Expansion of National Highway network is a continuous process and declaration of new National Highway is taken up from time to time depending upon, requirement of connectivity, inter-se priority and availability of funds.
- (c) 21 roads/State Highways have been converted/upgraded into National Highways during each of the last three years in the country including Chhattisgarh.
- (d) to (f) Presently, the priority of the Government is to develop and maintain the already existing National Highway network. However, expansion of National Highway network is a continuous process and declaration of new National Highway is taken up from time to time depending upon, requirement of connectivity, inter-se priority and availability of funds.
