- (e): In order to control prices, the export of wheat is banned w.e.f. 09/02/2007. Further, the import duty was reduced to Zero percent w.e.f. 09/09/2006. Government has made additional adhoc allocation of 10 Million tons of rice & wheat during 2011-12 to States & Union Territories under Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS). This comprises of 5 million tons each to BPL and APL families at BPL/APL issue prices.
