Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether the India accounts for the largest number of cases of HIV-TB co-infection in the world;

(b) if so, the details of such co-infections reported during each of the last three years and the current year, State/UT-wise;

(c) whether the Government has taken note on the achievements made under the Trichur model which focuses on integrating HIV/AIDS treatment with the mainstream health care system;

(d) if so, the details thereof; and

(e) the steps taken/proposed by the Government to follow this model in other parts of the country?

Answer

(a) & (b): No. India is not having the largest number of cases of HIV-TB co-infection in the world. As per Global TB Control Report 2010, South Africa accounts for the largest number of cases of HIV-TB co-infection in the world. A statement indicating number of cases of HIV-TB co-infection during the last three years and the current year State/UT-wise is annexed.

(c) to (e): Yes. Government is aware of Trichur model, which focuses on integrating HIV/AIDS treatment with the mainstream of health care system. The existing system of provisioning of treatment for HIV-TB co-infection follows the same approach as being shown in the Trichur model, whereby the hospitals having the Anti-retroviral Treatment Centre constitutes a multi- disciplinary team to ensure that the services of Voluntary Counselling and Testing, Post-exposure Prophylaxis, integrated medical care and involvement of entire health system is ensured.
