- (a) and (b): Yes, Madam. Since January, 2009, Air India has closed its offices at Mauritius, Lusaka, Dar-es-Salaam, Lagos, Nairobi, Montreal, San francisco, Houston, Vancouver, Birmingham, Auckland, Copenhagen and Brussels.
- (c): Air India is likely to save approximately Rs.528 lakhs per year due to closure of these offices.
