(a), (b) & (c): Under the existing Rule 16(3) of the All India Services (Death-cum-Retirement Benefits) Rules 1958, the Central Government may retire a member of the All India Service, in public interest, from service on the date on which such member completes 30 years of qualifying service or attains 50 years of age or any date thereafter to be specified in the notice.
