**Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:**

- (a) whether the results of the Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET) conducted by CBSE declared recently;
- (b) if so, the number of candidates who have cleared two or more than two exams therein;
- (c) the cut off percentage thereof and the reasons for keeping that cut-off percentage;
- (d) whether CBSE keeps the same cut-off percentage for other exams conducted by it across the country;
- (e) if so, the details thereof; and
- (f) the time by which the shortage of teachers is likely to be met?

**Answer**

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. D. PURANDESWARI)

(a): Yes sir.

(b): The number of candidates who have cleared both the papers is 23496

(c): The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has followed guidelines issued by the National Council for Teachers Education (NCTE). As per NCTE guidelines, a person who secures 60% or above marks in the CTET exam is declared qualified. School managements (Government, local Bodies, government aided and unaided) may consider giving concessions to persons belonging to SC/ST, OBC, differently abled persons, in accordance with respective reservation policy.

(d) to (e): The other Professional Examinations conducted by the CBSE are All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Examination Test (AIPMT) and All India Engineering Entrance Examination (AIEEE). The cut-off in these examinations are determined by the user agencies.

(f): Recruitment of teachers is a continuous process. The vacancies also keep on arising on account of retirement, resignation and expansion. Time to time vacancies are filled up.
