- (a) whether the Government is unable to produce Ethanol according to the demand due to the pressure of some foreign countries;
- (b) if so, the reaction of the Government thereto;
- (c) the quantity of the production of ethanol during each of the last three years and the current year; and
- (d) the steps taken by the Government for increasing the production of Ethanol?

(a)(b) & (d) No Sir. However, production of ethanol in the country is insufficient to meet the requirement of different sectors. In India, almost the entire Ethanol is produced from sugarcane molasses. Hence, ethanol production in India is heavily dependent on production of sugar and sugarcane, which fluctuates due to their cyclic nature. Government, under the Sugar Development Fund Rules, 1983, provide soft loans, upto 40% of the project cost, to the sugar mills for setting up ethanol projects to improve their viability via value addition to their by-product namely molasses.

(c) The quantity of the production of Ethanol during the last three years, as available is as under:
