(a) and (b): Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) was established in 1969 for promoting Social Science research - strengthening of different disciplines, improving quality and quantum of Social Science research and its utilization in national policy formulation. To realize these objectives, the Council has been providing financial assistance for conducting research projects, for awarding research fellowships, for holding training courses in research methodology in the Social Sciences, for organizing national and international seminars/conferences, for conducting survey of research in different disciplines of the Social Sciences; providing documentation services to scholars; and establishing collaborative linkages with social scientists in other countries.

(c) The main objectives of ICSSR as per their Memorandum of Association are to review the progress of Social Science research and to give advice to its users in Government or outside; to administer grants to institutions and individuals for research in Social Sciences; to provide technical assistance for formulation of Social Sciences research programmes, and to coordinate research activities in the field of Social Sciences, and, therefore, it indirectly promotes economic growth through social development and research. However, the objectives of ICSSR are not directly related to scientific and industrial development, for which there are special agencies like Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) set up by the Government.
