- (c) whether these institutes train students for international events as per the international standards;
- (d) if so, details of the facilities provided and number of students who participated in such events during each of the last three years and the current year, event-wise;
- (e) whether the Government proposes to open more such institutes; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof?

(a) Two autonomous institutions viz. Lakshmbai National University of Physical Education (LNUPE), Gwalior and Sports Authority of India (SAI) which are fully funded by the Government of India are providing physical education and sports education in the country.
