Will the Minister of CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government propses to set-up new units/plants in the country, particularly in West Bengal for increasing the production of Chemicals Fertilizers kto meet the growing demand during Eleventh Five Year Plan;

(b) If so, the reasons therefor; and

(c) the funds likely to be invested for the purposes ?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS (SHRI SRIKANT KUMAR KJENA)

(a) to (c) : In view of the increasing gap in demand and supply of urea in the country, the Government is encouraging companies for setting up of new urea plants within the country. Towards this end, a New Pricing Policy for attracting new investments in urea sector has also been announced by the Government on 4th September, 2008. The decision regarding setting up of a new unit/plant in the country willentirely be dependent upon the assessment of the investor who may be willing to invest in this sector in view of the emerging demand production gap and the attractive investment policy.

Further, the Government has decided to revive the closed units of erstwhile Fertilizer Corporation of India Ltd. and Hindustran Fertilizer Corporation Ltd. including their closed units at Durgapur and Haldai, which fall under West Bengal, subject to finalization of fully tied up revival prposaals. An Empowered Committee of Secretaries kunder the chairmanship of Secretary (Fertilizer) has been constituted to look into the various possible options for revival of these closed lunits inclduing closed units in the State of West Bengal. A final decision has not been taken in the matter.

It is estimated that setting up of a one million tonne urea plant would cost approximately Rs. 4,500-5,000 crore.
