Will the Minister of COAL be pleased to state:

(a) whether the price of coal has gone up by 89% in the country during the period between 2004 and 2011;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether the increase in wholesale price index is only 54% during the said period;

(d) if so, the details thereof;

(e) whether the coal industry of the country is unable to cater to the needs of the consumers despite the said increase in prices; and

(f) if so, the reasons therefor?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE FOR COAL (SHRI PRATIK PRAKASHBAPU PATIL)

(a)&(b): No, Sir. During the period the prices of coal have been revised three times and the compound increase from 2004 level is only 39.19%.

(c)&(d): No, Sir. As per the data published by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India, the WPI (for all commodities) for 2010-11 is 143.32 against 100 for the Base Year 2004-05, showing an increase of 43.32% only.

(e)&(f): Yes, Sir. Though, demand of coal has not been affected by increase in prices of coal, it is a fact that domestic coal supply is not able to meet the total coal demand. The major constraints in increasing production are:

(i) Mining Land acquisition difficulties

(ii) Rehabilitation & Resettlement issues

(iii) Forest & Environment clearance

(iv) Law & order problems in many coal mining areas
