- (a) whether the researchers at Indian Institute of Technology, Kharagpur have developed a Rapid Diagnostic Test (RDT) device that can test blood for diseases such as malaria, dengue and tuberculosis at a very low cost; and
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with the reaction of the Government thereto?

(a) & (b): Yes, Sir. Research is currently going on at the IndianInstitute of Technology (IIT), Kharagpur, towards development of Rapid Diagnostic Test (RDT) devices withthe eventual objective of low-cost testing of blood for diseases such as malaria, dengue and tuberculosis. The research has several phases and the initial disease-independent technology plat-form has shown promising preliminary results. Being an on-going research project, no time-frame can be given.
