SHORTAGE OF NON TEACHING STAFF

**Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:**

- (a) whether there is acute shortage of non-teaching and para- medical staff in Sir Sunderlal Hospital, Banaras Hindu University (BHU), Varanasi;
- (b) if so, the reasons therefor alongwith the number of posts lying vacant in the Institute of Medical Science, BHU, category-wise; and
- (c) the corrective measures taken/proposed to be taken by the Government to meet the shortage of above staff and also to fill up these vacancies at the earliest?

**Answer**

(a)to(c): Pursuant to the norms prescribed by Ministry of Finance, the teaching to non-teaching staff ratio in the centrally funded institutions has been fixed at 1:1.1. According to the information furnished by Banaras Hindu University (BHU), Varanasi, the teaching and non-teaching staff ratio in the Institute of Medical Science of the University is 1:1.35 which already exceeds the prescribed ratio.
