## Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the maoist violence in areas under the Integrated Action Plan (IAP) have prompted the Government to extend the scheme to 20 more Naxal-hit districts;
- (b) if so, names of the districts, State-wise;
- (c) whether any district of Andhra Pradesh does figure in the list;
- (d) if so, the details thereof;
- (e) the total amount of fund spent so far in the 60 naxal affected districts; and
- (f) the impact and the outcome of the implementation of the IAP in the naxal affected districts in various States of the country?

## **Answer**

- (a) to (d): A proposal to extend the Integrated Action Plan (IAP) to more districts is under consideration of the Government and a decision is yet to be taken.
- (e) & (f): The Integrated Action Plan was approved on 25.11.2010. An amount of Rs. 1389.24 crore has been reported as expenditure by the districts under the Integrated Action Plan against the amount of Rs. 2500 crore released so far i.e. 55.57% (as on 25.11.2011). Out of the 60,870 works which have been taken up, the districts have reported that 26,568 works have been completed i.e. 43.65%. It is too early to make an impact assessment of the programme. However, the IAP is being closely monitored both at the State and Central levels.
