- (a) whether World Meteorological Organization, a UN body has recently predicted, "EL NINO" effect on the South East Asian countries including India, as a result of which there is likelihood of a long dry spell in the country adversely affecting monsoons; and
- (b) if so, the details thereof?

Although, the World Meteorological Organisation (WMO) statement on El Nino issued on 18th June,2009 has predicted a likelihood of an El Niño event over the tropical Pacific in the second half of 2009, it has not given any statement regarding its effect on the Southeast Asian countries including India. In fact as a matter of policy, WMO do not include country level impacts in their statements. Instead it is left to the meteorological services of the concerned countries to issue the statements based on appropriate impact assessments. While issuing forecasts for the monsoon-2009 rainfall over the country, India Meteorological Department (IMD) has taken into account the possible impact of El Nino on the monsoon rainfall during the current season.
