- (e) whether the Government proposes to open new institutions for imparting education in air control in various parts of the country; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof?

- (a) & (b) The present strength of 2135 controllers adequately meets the current operational requirements.
- (c) 300 Controllers have been recruited in July, 2011.
- (d) A study on the long-term manpower requirement for ATCOs in India has been completed through an external Agency. The final report is expected shortly.
- (e) & (f) No, Madam. AAI imparts training in ATC at three institutions located at Allahabad, Gondia and Hyderabad.
