- (c) whether the amount allocated for MDMS is more than the amount allocated for the infrastructure and the constituents of SSA;
- (d) if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) whether the Government adopts an integrated approach in the implementation of various Centrally sponsored programmes in the education sector and if so, the details thereof?

- (a): The various Centrally Sponsored Schemes being implemented in the education sector are at Annexure I.
- (b): The details of funds released under the Mid-Day Meal Scheme and Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan during 2008-09 to 2011-12 are at Annexure II.
- (c) & (d): No, Sir. As may be seen from Annexure II, the releases under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan are higher than the releases under MDM Scheme.
- (e): Yes, Sir. The Government adopts an integrated approach in the implementation of the various centrally sponsored schemes, in keeping with principles of the National Policy on Education, to ensure education of equitable quality for all to fully harness the nation's human potential. The common objectives are to enhance access through expansion of quality school education; promote equity through inclusion of disadvantaged groups and weaker sections, and improve the quality of education.
