STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF STARRED QUESTION NO. 227 BY SHRI AHIR VIKRAMBHAI ARJANBHAI MAADAM TO BE ANSWERED IN LOK SABHA ON 29.03.2012 REGARDING PANTRY CARS IN LONG DISTANCE TRAINS.

(a): 212 pairs of Mail/Express trains running for more than 1000 kilometres, presently do not have a pantry car.

(b) to (d): The attachment of pantry cars to trains is considered based on various factors such as priority of the train, (first priority to Duronto/Rajdhani then Super fast Mail/Express trains then the trains running more than 24 hours either way), commercial justification, availability of pantry cars, load limitation in the trains etc. In cases where trains are not provided with a Pantry Car, the catering services are provided through Train Side Vending (TSV) or through static catering units at stations.
