- (b) if so, whether the Government has taken any action in this regard; and

(a)to(c): No Madam, So far as CBI is concerned a total of 2359 cases have been disposed from trial during last 3 years i.e. 2009,2010,& 2011 and the conviction rate is hovering in between 65% to 70%. The year wise conviction rate during the last 3 years i.e. 2009, 2010 & 2011 is as follows:

Year Conviction rate during the year.

2009 64.4%

2010 70.8%

No action is called for, as the conviction rate is not abysmally less, which has been reflected in the above table.
