(a) & (b) Yes, Sir. Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, had a provision for 140 ambulances for the last three years under the Eleventh Five Year Plan, out of which 70 ambulances have been provided. 136 cranes have been provided in the same period. Details are at Annexure.

In addition under PPP projects, concessionaires provided ambulances at every 50 km stretch and cranes at every Toll Plaza.
