(a) to (e): Yes Sir. Suggestions have been received to reduce the number of colleges affiliated to a University. The Central Government is acutely aware of the need to reform the affiliation system and the same has been highlighted in the Approach Paper to the XII Plan. Accordingly, a Central Sponsored Scheme (CSS) has been envisioned by the Ministry of Human Resource Development for approval in the XII Plan. The scheme would seek to incentivise State Governments to implement reforms in the affiliation system so that Universities are not overburdened due to affiliation of a large number of colleges to them. Details of the scheme are being worked out.
