(a): No OBC candidate recommended by UPSC from Civil Services Examination 2008, 2009 and 2010 had been denied offer of appointment due to conflict of creamy layer. The officers are nominated for Foundation Course (FC), if they are fit for appointment before commencement of FC.

(b): Rule 3 of Civil Services Examination Rules envisages that the number of vacancies to be filled on the basis of the examination will b e specified in the Notice issued by the Commission. Reservation will be made for candidates belonging to Schedule Castes, Schedule Tribes, Other Backward Classes and Physically Disabled categories in respect of vacancies as may be fixed by the Government. Further, under Rule 16 of the said Rules the UPSC for the purpose of recommending OBC, SC, ST candidates may relax the general qualifying standard with reference to number of reserved vacancies in these categories.
