(a) and (b) As on 31st December, 2011, the following requests had been received from private Indian carriers for grant of traffic rights for various schedules on overseas sectors (in seats/week):

I.Jet Airways - 24000 seats (approx.)

II.Kingfisher Airlines - 20000 seats (approx.)

III.Spice Jet - 66000 seats(approx.)

V.Indigo - 20000 seats(approx.)

(c) and (d) the requests were under the consideration of the Government pending formulation of the policy to enhance utilization of unutilized traffic rights created under various agreements.
