- (c) whether any irregularities, corruption and mismanagement were reported in these cases;
- (d) if so, the details of the inquiry conducted by the Government in this regard; and
- (e) the action taken by the Government against these defaulting firms?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 323 FOR 27th APRIL, 2012

There have been no instances of supply of sub-standard drugs/medicines and equipment to the Central Government Hospitals from black listed pharmaceutical companies. Similarly, there have been no such cases in respect of medicines/vaccines and equipment being supplied by Central Government to States under various national health programmes.

Under NRHM, funds are provided to States for implementation of various programmes and sortie of these funds are utilized by States for procurement of drugs/medicines and equipment for their public health facilities. The States are responsible for procuring such drugs/medicines and ensuring proper utilization bf funds given to them under NRHM.
