Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is shortage of trained personnel in the Central Para-Military Forces (CPMFs);
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government proposes to recruit retired Armed Forces Personnel in the CPMFs; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and the time by which a final decision is likely to be taken in this regard?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI JITENDRA SINGH)

- (a) & (b): No Madam. Recruitment in the Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) is a continuous and dynamic process & the requirements arising on account of new raisings/resignations/ voluntary retirements/annual wastage, etc. are duly taken into account while making such recruitments. All the personnel so recruited are imparted proper training as per the requirements.
- (c) to (d): As per the instructions/rules of Government of India, Ex-servicemen from the Armed Forces are already being recruited in Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) and Assam Rifles & suitable provisions have been incorporated in the Recruitment Rules. Government of India already has in place Ex-Servicemen (Re-employment in Central Civil Service and Posts) Rules, 1979, which are amended from time to time.
