STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (e) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 218 FOR ANSWER ON 27.8.2012

The soldiers of the Indian Army have not left their jobs for loss of interest therein. The Army personnel perform their duties in congenial environment. Some Army officers / personnel have been granted premature retirement on various grounds. The details of Premature Retirement (PMR) / Resignation granted in respect of Army officers (excluding AMC, ADC, MNS) and JCOs / OR along with the reasons during the last three years are as under:-

2. Nevertheless, Government has taken various steps to reduce stress among army personnel, viz., deployment of psychological counsellors, improvement in quality of food and clothing, liberalised leave policy and establishing a grievance redressal mechanism for defence personnel in the States etc. The steps taken to reduce the stress level amongst troops have yielded positive results.
