- (f) if so, the status of the implementation thereof?

(a) to (f): The policy of health check / AIDS testing of foreigners was reviewed in consultation with Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in 2002 and it was decided to dispense with the requirement of mandatory HIV testing of foreigners. Accordingly necessary guidelines were circulated to all concerned in 2002 and the same has been reiterated in 2012.
