- (a) whether the Government has received any suggestions for operating larger flights for Haj pilgrimage season;
- (b) if so, the measures taken in this regard; and
- (c) the details of the flights likely to be operated for this purpose?

## **Answer**

## MINISTER OF THE STATE (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) IN THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI PRAFUL PATEL)

- (a) and (b): Yes, Sir. The Government has received requests for deploying larger aircrafts from Calicut. A Memorandum of Understanding(MOU) was signed with M/s. National Air Services(NAS) of Saudi Arabia to carry around 7,500 pilgrims from Calicut to Jeddah. NAS had provided aircrafts having a capacity of 238 seats and had agreed to mount additional capacity towards the end of Phase I to make good any possible shortfall.
- (c) Air India is operating direct flights to Saudi Arabia with B747-400, A330-200, A310 and A320 aircraft. As per the MOU signed with Saudi Arabia Airlines (SAA) and NAS they are required to operate wide bodied aircraft for the Haj 2009 operations.
