- (d) if so, the details thereof?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF STARRED QUESTION NO.12 BY SHRI ASHOK KUMAR RAWAT TO BE ANSWERED IN LOK SABHA ON 02.07.2009 REGARDING SHORTAGE OF COACHES.

(a) to (d): Taking into account the unfulfilled demands for introduction of trains, there is shortage of coaches on Indian Railways.

As on date, about 555 EMU coaches and 91 broad gauge conventional coaches, which have outlived their codal life, are being used on train services after ensuring their safe running and provision of all passenger amenities.

A new rail coach factory is being set up at Rae Bareli, Uttar Pradesh. Work for the land acquisition and setting up the factory is in progress. Another Rail Coach Factory is proposed to be set up at Palakkad, Kerala for which requisite approval is under process.
