- (b) whether the Government is considering a nationwide study under the aegis of Sangeet Natak Akademi (SNA) to document and record the ICH of the country; and

- (a) The UNESCO Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage, 2003 was ratified by India in 2005. Since then 34 Indian elements on Intangible Cultural Heritage (ICH) have been nominated for consideration in the Representative List of ICH, out of which 9 elements have been inscribed. Nominations of the remaining 25 elements are currently pending with UNESCO for their consideration and will be decided as per provisions of the Convention. Sangeet Natak Akademi, an autonomous organisation under the Ministry of Culture has been entrusted with the task of preparing nomination dossiers and their submission to UNESCO.
