- (a) the details of items traded between India and Nepal during each of the last three years, item-wise alongwith the revenue earned therefrom:

- (d) whether trade of non-State items have been increasing between the countries over a period of time; and

- (a) The major items traded between India and Nepal during each of last three years are Petroleum (crude & products), Iron & Steel, Drugs, Pharmaceuticals & Chemicals, Machinery & Instruments, Plastic, Spices, Cotton yarn, Non –Ferrous Metals, Textile articles, Vegetable oil, Cement, Machine tools etc. The details of bilateral Trade between in India and Nepal are available on the website of Department of Commerce, www.commerce.nic.in under the heading "Information Dissemination- Export Import Data Bank".
- (b) &(c) The trade between the two countries takes place through trading points recognised by India-Nepal Treaty of Trade. Customs offices are in place for proper checking on the Trade on both sides of the trading points. To check illegal trade across this open border, enforcement agencies such as Sashastra Seema Bal and Customs formations are active on the India-Nepal border.
