(a) whether the Government has removed the ban on export of branded edible oil;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether the Government has decided to set up a committee to calibrate the minimum export price from time to time; and

(d) if so, the details thereof?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) IN THE MINISTRY OF CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD & PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION (PROF. K.V. THOMAS)

(a) & (b) Yes, Madam. Export of edible oils in branded consumer packs of upto 5 kg was allowed with a ceiling of 20,000 tons per annum. Recently Government has removed the quantitative limit on export of edible oils in branded consumer packs of upto 5 Kg with a Minimum Export Price of USD 1500 per MT vide Notification dated 5th February, 2013 issued by Department of Commerce.

(c) & (d) Yes, Government has set up an inter-ministerial committee to calibrate the Minimum Export Price from time to time under the Chairmanship of Commerce Secretary. Secretary, Consumer Affairs and Secretary, Food & Public Distribution are the members of the committee.
