(a)to(c): Recently the Justice J.S. Verma Committee on Amendments of the Criminal Law has recommended the introduction of sex education in a clinical manner in schools through trained teachers and child counsellors. The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) and the National Council of Educational Research & Training (NCERT) are already taking the following measures:

- # The materials produced for the adolescence Education Programmes like Skills and Health and Wellness as well as Values Education deal with gender and adolescent issues in a sensitive manner.
- # The Adolescence Education Programme (AEP) focusing on three major concerns i.e.
- (i) The process of growing up during adolescence,
- (ii) The prevention of HIV/AIDS and
- (iii) The prevention of Substance (Drug) Abuse, has been implemented by the NCERT through the CBSE, the Council of Boards of School Education (COBSE) and the State Education Boards.
