(a) The sanctioned and actual strength of Geologists in Geological Survey of India (GSI) and Indian Bureau of Mines (IBM) is as follows:

Recruitment of geologists is made on an annual basis through Geologist's Examination conducted by UPSC whose year wise status since 2006 is as under:
