UPGRADING FENCING ALONG BORDERS
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Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there are reports of damage to fencing due to snowfall, flood and corrosion at the borders;
- (b) if so, whether the Government proposes to erect snow and flood resistant fencing at the borders;
- (c) if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) if not, the remedial measures taken by the Government in this regard?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI MULLAPPALLY RAMACHANDRAN)

(a): Yes, the damage to border fence being manned by the Border Security Force(BSF) has been reported due to flood and corrosion. However, the stretch of Indo-Pakistan and Indo-Bangladesh borders having fence does not witness snow-fall. The details of damaged border fence along Indo-Pakistan and Indo-Bangladesh borders due to various natural factors such as flood, high velocity winds, shifting sand dunes, corrosion, rainfall etc are as under:-

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- $(b)\&(c): At \ present, \ there \ is \ no \ proposal \ regarding \ construction \ of \ flood \ resistance \ fencing \ for \ flood-prone \ border \ areas.$
- (d): The executing agencies are repairing the damaged portion of Phase-I fencing under the Phase-III Scheme which was approved by the Government of India. At present, 790 km. of fencing has been completed out of sanctioned length of 861 km. along Indo-Bangladesh border.
