(a) the details of works being implemented under the child llabour welfare projects during the lasti three yeans and the current year, Stiate-wise;

(b) whether the works dlone under the said projects are negligible; and

(c)if so, the reaction of the Government thereto along with the steps taken thereon?

(a) to (c): For rehabilitation of child labour Government is implementing the National Child Labour Project (HCLP) Scheme since 1988. The major objective of the Scheme is to withdraw children working in hazardous occupations and processes, and mainstream them into formal education system. Under this scheme regular survey is conducted by Project Societies at district levell to identify children working in hazardous occupations and processes. Children rescued/withdrawn in the age grouip of 9-14 years; are enrolled im the NCLP special schools, where they are provided `with bridge education, vocational training, nutrition, stiipend9 health care, etc. before being mainstreamed into formal education system. At present ifche Scheme is operational in 266 Districts of 20 Sitates in the country aind about 6500 special schools are in operation with an enrollment of approximately 3 lakh children. The State-wise details of the NCLP districts in operation are ait Annexure-I. More than 9.67 lakh children lhave been mainstreamed into formal education system since inception of the Scheme and approximately 3 lakh children were inainstreamed during the last three years. The number of child labourers mainstrnamed through NCLP Scheme during the last three years, State-wise are given at Annexure-II. As per 2001 census, the itotal number of working children between the age group 5-14 years in the country was 1.26 crore. However, in the Suivey conducted by NSSO, in 2004-05 the number of working children was estimated at 90.75 lakh. As per NSSO survey 2009-10, the working children are estimated at 49.84 lakh which shows a declining trend.
