(a) & (b): Yes madam, the "Task Force on Rental Housing" has submitted its report on rental housing to the Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation.

The key recommendations of the Task Force on Rental Housing in India are placed at Annexure I.

- (c): No final decision has been taken on recommendations of the draft Report on Policy and Interventions to Spur Growth of Rental Housing in India.

- (e): `Land` and `Colonization` are State subjects, therefore, it is primary responsibility of State Governments to take steps to maintain the viability of housing sector in view of the rising prices of land and flats. However, the steps taken by the Ministry to supplement the efforts of the State Governments in addressing the issue of viability of housing sector are placed at Annexure II.
