- (a) whether women personnel remain under-represented in the Central Armed Police Force (CAPF);
- (b) if so, the current strength of women personnel and the reasons for their underrepresentation, Force and rank-wise; and
- (c) the details of the steps being taken to encourage the recruitment of women personnel so as to increase their representation in the Forces along with the achievements thereof?

Hazardous working conditions, difficult isolated places of posting, non availability of accommodation and other facilities in far flung and other isolated areas, staying away from the family, better job opportunities elsewhere could be some of the challenges for women to join forces. However, the representation of women in Central Armed Police Forces has increased over the years.

The details of the steps taken to further increase the representation of women in Central Armed Police Forces are given in the enclosed statement at Annexure-II. The Parliamentary Committee on Empowerment of Women also regularly monitors the status of representation and working conditions of women in Central Armed Police Forces.
